Venue

The meeting will be held in the conference rooms of **Grant Hotel**, in the City of Thessaloniki (<u>www.grandhotelpalace.gr</u>, tel: +302310 549000, fax: +302310 549449).

Transportation to venue

A free mini-bus service from the airport to the hotel will operate after special arrangement on 8 October 2013 and from the hotel to the airport on Sunday 13 October 2013.

Alternative are:

- by taxi (fare approximately 25 Euro) or
- by bus.

From the airport (SKG-Makedonia Airport) to the Grand Hotel (venue place). Thessaloniki has its own international airport, Makedonia. It is situated 10 Kilometres away from the city and 12 Km from the congress venue. Turn right at the airport exit onto the highway in the direction of Thessaloniki. Take the bus no. 78 to IKEA (every half hour from the Airport), and get off at the bus stop "IKEA-Leoforos Georgikis Sxolis". Change to the bus no. 08 on the way to Monastitiou Str. and get off the bus to the stop "Orizomiloi" near the Grand Hotel. There is an automatic ticket machine on the bus and you can buy tickets in kiosks found virtually everywhere but not at the airport. The average taxi fare from the airport to the hotel is € 25 and it takes 30 min.

From Grand Hotel to Thessaloniki City Center or airport. Take the bus no. 08 in front of the hotel, get of at the bus stop "IKEA-Leoforos Georgikis Sxolis" and change to the bus no.78 for the airport.

If you bring your own car, there is also a free parking area at the hotel. Participants traveling by air are strongly advised to book their flights early.

Accommodation

Accommodation for conference participants has been reserved at a **special conference price** for a restricted number of rooms in Grand Hotel. Prices are \notin 70 for a single room and \notin 85 for a double or twin room inclusive of VAT per night. Participants should make their own room reservations until 1. October 2003 (reservation form available at website of HFS: www.forestry.gr/prosliva meeting) and payment should be made by credit card (Visa, Mastercard, American Express) directly to the Grand Hotel.

Thessaloniki – a great place for a conference

Thessaloniki is one of the oldest cities in Europe, founded more than 300 years B.C. on a site of old prehistoric settlements going back to 2300 B.C., by Cassander, King of Macedonia, and was named after his wife, Thessaloniki, sister of Alexander the Great. It is now an important commercial port with a population of 1,000,000. Situated on the shores of the Thermaikos Gulf, the town is composed of two sectors, the modern sector and the old town. While the modern areas are full of excellent examples of recent architecture, monuments remain within the city dating from Roman and Byzantine times; From the Byzantine period, for which Thessaloniki is particularly famed, a visit to the churches and fine works of art that remain is a must.

Today Thessaloniki with its University and the International Trade Fair - a crossroad for peoples' friendship and collaboration - is a lively modern city bustling with life and movement. Large avenues, parks and squares, lines of trees that frame commercial streets with showy shop-windows. Old houses, neoclassical buildings, modern dwellings. Yesterday meets today at old taverns, restaurants next to hotels and luxury bars, cinema halls, theaters and confectioner's shops that arrange their seats and tables on street pavements and squares. Small family run taverns and basement pastry shops offer a delicious variety of famous Macedonian specialties, next to stalls of ice-cream sellers for busy passers by.

Survival Guide

Arrival and information

The train station on the west side of town is a short walk from the central grid of streets and the waterfront. If you're coming into Thessaloniki by bus you'll arrive at one of the KTEL terminals nearby. The main EOT tourist office is at Platía (Square) Aristotélous 8 (Mon–Fri 8am–8pm, Sat 8am–1.30pm; tel 031/271 888).

Weather

In Thessaloniki, in October, mean ar temperature is 19.7 $^{\circ}$ C with maximum daily air temperature 24.4 $^{\circ}$ C, while minimum temperature 14.3 $^{\circ}$ C. Relative humidity ranges between 50 and 70 %. It could be dry but occasional showers might occur (especially in mountains).

Communications

Stamps (*grammatósíma*) can be purchased at a corner kiosk (*períptero*) or at post offices, open Mon–Fri 7.30am–2pm. Internet access is good in Greece; all the larger towns and cities have internet cafes.

Emergencies

For minor medical complaints go to the local *farmakio* (pharmacy). If you regularly use any prescription drug you should bring along a copy of the prescription together with the generic name of the drug. For serious medical attention treatment is given

free in state hospitals.

Money and banks

Greek currency is the **EURO**. Traveller's cheques can be cashed at all banks and quite a number of hotels, agencies and tourist shops. Greek banks are normally open Mon–Thurs 8am–2pm and Fri 8am–1.30pm. Greece has an increasing number of ATMs which accept foreign-issued cards; this is often the easiest and cheapest way of obtaining funds.

Opening hours and holidays

Shopping hours are theoretically during Mon, Wed & Sat 8am–2pm and Tues, Thurs & Fri 9am–1.30pm & 5.30–8.30pm. But there are so many exceptions to the rule that you can't count on getting anything done except from Monday to Friday from 9.30am to 1.00pm or so.

Car Rental

Cars can be rented in Greece from local or international companies. Average cost per day for a medium sized car is \in 50.
